Message from Fr. Peter: Those who attended the children's mass at SJ's a couple of weeks will know that over the last month I have been obsessed watching 'The Traitor's, on BBC. Discussing the final with the Altar Servers at SP's last week I mentioned that (#spoiler alert) I would have preferred the Faithfuls (or even the Traitor Andrew) to win, partly because the eventual winner, Harry, had the really annoying of habit of using the phrase 'Oh my days!' all the time, at least once every sentence it would seem, as a term of shock, astonishment, wonder, or just for something to say. (The Altar Servers then challenged me to use the phrase in my sermon, which I duly did!). He used the phrase 'Oh my days' so often that it got me thinking where it originated from, so I did a bit of judicious internet research, which turned out quite interesting. Some articles suggested that as we now no longer live in a religious society the phrase, which remember is actually a PRAYER, 'Oh my God', has ceased to make sense, so is replaced by 'Oh my days'. Other articles suggested that it was used instead of 'Oh my God' by those who did not want to take the Lord's name in vain, and also suggested that this is why many people use 'Oh my gosh'. Others suggest it has Caribbean origins, or at least from the Caribbean community in London. Interesting suggestions, but the phrase 'Oh, my days' is actually first recorded as being used at the end of the nineteenth century, a sort of oath or admission that your having difficult times, originally being 'Law, My days!'. However it's used, if it means we don't take the Lord's name in vain, then that's a good thing. But remember 'Oh my God' is also a prayer, so let us use that phrase daily, but in a spirit of prayer, praise, love, admiration, and contemplation of the presence of God in our daily lives. And if ever you hear my say something unexpected in a sermon, it maybe cause the altar servers have bet me I could say it in my homily...
