ADVENT – A TIME OF WAITING AND PREPARING FOR THE COMING OF OUR SAVIOUR:

Let's continue this journey through Advent together. Each week we explore ways we can prepare for the coming of the light of the world. First, place a candle where you can sit quietly and think and pray.

THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT: THE CANDLE OF PEACE.



We remember the prophets who spoke of the coming of Christ, of how a Saviour would be born, a king in the line of David. Isaiah called Christ "The Prince of Peace." When Jesus came, he taught the people the importance of being peacemakers. We light our candle to remind us that Jesus is "The Prince of Peace" and that through him peace is found. (*Light the candle*). Peace is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of the candle, we celebrate the peace we find in Jesus.

Let us pray. Lord Jesus Christ, Light of the World, Prince of Peace, give peace in our hearts at Christmastide. We ask, as we wait for you to come again, that you would remain present with us. Help us today and every day to hear your word and to do your will by sharing your peace with each other. We ask this in the name of the one who was born in Bethlehem. **Amen**

HOW CAN WE SHOW PEACE? We have the ability to influence those around us. This week let us be a catalyst for peace and kindness. It is easier to spread peacefulness on the outside when you begin from a place of calm and peace on the inside. Start with yourself. Breathe slowly and deeply. Set yourself the intention to practice peace and calm. Your positive energy will spread and grow in and through others. Listen first. This will be appreciated by the talker. Lower your voice and speak slowly. Your calm will be contagious and may slow someone down if they are getting emotionally worked up. Offer compassion to someone who is struggling. Help them to feel understood. Resist the urge to judge others or to cast blame. Offer a kind act or helping hand.
