This Week's Readings:

Our actions have consequences – and our faith should have the consequences of us wanting to live out what we have to come know through the Spirit.

First Reading: Genesis 3:9-15 The consequences of the Fall of Mankind, as Adam and Eve admit of eating the fruit from the Tree of Knowledge.

Second Reading: Corinthians 4:13-5:1 Paul reminds us of the great joy and gift of faith in Christ, and how it should make us want to live fruitful lives.

Gospel: Mark 3:20-35 There is great misunderstanding about who the person of Jesus Christ really is – but those who do so, will always do the will of His Father in Heaven.

Message from Fr. Peter: It was lovely to see a good group of people at SPs on Monday evening for our first Evening Prayer in preparation for the Diocesan Centenary. Evening Prayer is actually one of the so called 'hours' of the Church, the 'Liturgy of the Hours' which make up a whole day (and night) of prayer. The hours of prayer officially take place every three hours, beginning with Lauds, at three am in the morning, followed by Prime, Terce, Sext at Midday, None, Vespers in the evening, with Compline before bed, and finally Matins at Midnight. Whilst the Hours were originally based on prayer times for Monasteries (which in some are still prayed at the actual hours), Vatican II encouraged certain Hours to be prayed be all, especially Morning and Evening Prayer. These two prayer times consist of the recitation of Old Testament Psalms, a New Testament Canticle, a little passage of Scripture, and Bidding Prayers, as well as the Benedictus in the morning (Zachariah's prayer of praise at the birth of his son, John the Baptist), the Magnificat (Mary's prayer of praise at the coming of her son, Jesus) in the evening, and at Night Prayer, a short time of reflection on the day before bed, we pray the Nunc Dimmitus (the prayer of Simeon as he prepared himself for a happy death, having seen the child Jesus at his Presentation in the Temple). You will see me wandering around the Church like a monk (the beard helps, I guess) saying the Hours before Mass, fulfilling the promise I made at my ordination to ground - or elevate - the day in a spirit of prayer. I use the 'Universalis' App on my Kindle (which also includes all the texts of the Mass). Our next Evening Prayer, celebrating the Precious Blood of Jesus, will be on Monday 1st July at 7pm at St. Joseph's. Everyone, as always, is more than welcome. God our Father, you separated light and darkness to bring us night and day. May our words and actions every single hour confess your name and profess your glory. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
