St Joseph's Care: If you, or someone you know is in need, St Joseph's Care has a helpline and we have volunteers who will be in a position to provide basic support such as shopping. The number is:

07840 112 265 (9am – 7pm daily). **ALSO:** We continue to support needy families in the South Shore area with food and clothing vouchers. Contributions towards this can be deposited in the safe at the back of church or put in an envelope clearly marked St Joseph's Care and posted through the presbytery door or dropped in the basket as you leave church at weekend.

Foodbank: In conjunction with local churches we are currently supporting the foodbank which is helping people in our immediate community, any donations should be left in the basket at the back of church. Items particularly requested at this time are Long Life Full Fat Milk, Cereals, Tinned Potatoes and Tinned Tomatoes, Tea and Coffee.

Burkina Faso: Normally we would have an annual fundraising which would be open for private donation from June until September but because of the pandemic this has not been possible. Instead we will collect any donations for this cause from next weekend and close the appeal at the end of September. Donations should be placed in an envelope and placed in the collection basket or dropped through the presbytery door. Cheques should be made payable to 'St Joseph's (Burkina Faso)'. A PRAYER TO YOUR GUARDIAN ANGEL: Dear Guardian Angel, go for me to the church, there kneel down at Mass for me. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Saviour Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God have mercy.
