

This Week's Readings: We meet in the name of the risen Jesus to celebrate his presence, draw on his power, and learn from him how we can serve him more effectively in our world.

First Reading *Acts 3:13-15. 17-19* Peter explains to the crowds in Jerusalem that the death and resurrection of Jesus were foretold in the scriptures.

Second Reading *1 John 2:1-5* The apostle John reassures us that our sins can be forgiven, and encourages us to keep God's commandments.

Gospel Luke 24:35-48 In this resurrection appearance of Jesus the disciples are given new hope and new understanding, and they are promised new power.

Message from Fr. Peter: Last Wednesday we had a jolly Bingo Evening at St. Peter's, raising funds for Club Day, which was great fun, and heartily enjoyed by all (I think just about every table won a bingo or raffle prize, so hope everybody left happy!). As usual I had the honour of being the Bingo Caller, a job which I've been doing since the age of about ten. In my home parish of St. Mary's, Cleator there was a weekly 'Lourdes Bingo' to raise money for sending sick and helpers to Lourdes, and when the usual caller was unable to do their duty (which seemed to be quite often) my Mother would get a phone call asking if she could send me up to call which I did (and incidentally these Bingo's sent me to Lourdes as a helper several times – right up until I went with them the very year I was ordained, which was the last time I went, thirty years ago; perhaps it's time to go again. Anyway...). So it was on these Monday nights that I learnt all the usual calls, the Kelly's Eye Number One (which actually refers to the eye slot on the helmet of the Australian outlaw Ned Kelly), through Doctor's Order's Number Nine (which refers to a laxative pill administered by military doctors during the Second World War), right through the 'Top of the Shop Number Ninety' (the highest number in Bingo, for those unfamiliar). I always add a few of mine own invented calls (Fifty-six, the Hungarian Uprising of Budapest), but there are many more which could be invented, not least a whole possible series of 'Church Bingo Numbers': how about Two and Seven: the number of books in the New Testament; Nine, the number of writers of the New Testament; One, the number of English Popes; Two and Three, the Lord's My Shepherd; right up to Nine-O blind ninety, the age of Abraham's Wife Sarah, when she gave birth to Isaac. I wonder if she was a bingo player?

And talking of the Bingo: £252:20 was raised for Club Day funds. Huge thanks to the organisers and everyone who came along and dabbed their numbers.
