This Week's Readings: Brothers and sisters in Christ, St Paul calls us children of light and children of the day. May we rejoice in the gifts God gives us, and share God's blessings with the world.

First Reading *Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31* The power and influence of a good woman is an image of wisdom. Second Reading *1 Thessalonians 5:1-6* In Jesus Christ we live in the light. We have no excuse for deeds of darkness. Gospel *Matthew 25:14-30* The parable of the talents points to capable people who refuse to live a generous life.

Message from Fr. Peter: Each week at the end of the Confirmation Sessions over the past couple of months, all the cnadidates have come into Church to discuss, and then pray, a particular prayer - the Our Father, Haily Mary, Glory Be, various Acts of Contrition, and the Prayer to the Holy Spirit. We've also prayed the Angelus, which proved to be unfamiliar to the candidates, as well as some of the older people who joined us. The Angelus is a special prayer in which we remember the Incarnation of Jesus, the moment that Jesus was made flesh on this earth, the moment Mary conceived Jesus in her womb, when she allowed God's will to be done at the Annunciation, as recorded in the first chapter of the Gospel of St. Luke. The prayer comprises the words and the responses of the Angel Gabriel and the Blessed Virgin Mary, each followed by the Hail Mary, which also includes the words of Mary's cousin, Elizabeth. It is often led by a leader with everyone responding, and joining in with the Hail Mary and the final part of the prayer, which reminds us that Christ's coming to earth - the Incarnation - means that we can one day go to heaven. It is traditionally said three times a day - at morning, noon and evening - and our church bells often ring to call us to celebrate this beautiful prayer. We say the Angelus before Weekday Mass a SJ's, and from this week we will also start saying the prayer at the beginning of Mass at SP's. I've put some copies of the prayer at the back of Church in case anyone needs familiarising with this beautiful devotion, the text of which is: The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary, And she conceived of the Holy Spirit. Hail Mary... Behold the handmaid of the Lord. Be it done unto me according to thy word. Hail Mary, full of grace... And the Word was made flesh. And dwelt among us. Hail Mary, full of grace... Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Let us pray: Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy grace into our hearts; that, we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ, Thy Son, was made known by the message of an angel, may by His Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of His Resurrection. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
