This Week's Readings: Whatever storms or trials we find ourselves facing in life, Jesus teaches us not to be afraid but to put our trust in him.

First Reading Job 38:1, 8-11 God keeps the sea within its bounds. Second Reading 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 Christ has brought us to a new creation. Gospel Mark 4:35-41 Jesus controls the elements of wind and sea. Message from Fr. Peter: This Tuesday is the Lancaster Diocesan Optional Memorial of Our Lady of Fernyhalgh. Fernyhalgh is in our southern part of the Diocese Shrine to Our Lady, which I'm sure many of you know, just off the A6 at Broughton. Fernyhalgh or Ladyewell has been a place of pilgrimage and devotion for many centuries with continuity through times of persecution right through to the present day. Pilgrimages from Salford and Liverpool dioceses, as well as our own, take place each year, as well as many other gatherings of prayer. An undated legend tells of an Irish merchant swearing to build a chapel in thanks for surviving a storm at sea, and being directed here by a dream. The well was a pool of water retained within its present walls until in 1905 the nuns occupying the house paved it, constructed steps down to the new well-head, and added a statue. Today it is a special place for the memory of our local martyrs as well as the devotion to Our Blessed Lady. There is a beautiful open chapel, which the names of all the Diocesan Martyrs named on it. As we think about this place of pilgrimage we should give thanks for the witness of faith which has been handed down to us to be live with faithfulness and love. Almighty God and Father, the legend of the well has carried over centuries devotion to Our Lady of Fernyhalgh even when to be faithful was a call to martyrdom. In contemplating the passion of your Son our forefathers called upon Mary as Our Lady of Pity. May we today confront the more subtle challenges of the world to our faith as we renew or prayers for your protection through the intercession of Mary, mother of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, One God, for ever and ever. Amen.
