This Week's Readings: We are Christ's body here on earth. It is his love that gathers us together, in our weakness, to be strengthened through word and sacrament.

First Reading 2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8-12, 14, 16 The true house of God is not the physical building that the king wants to build, but rather the sovereignty and security that God promises to David and his descendants.

Second Reading *Romans* 16:25-27 Jesus Christ is the revelation of the mystery kept secret for endless ages. He is the culmination of all prophecy and must, therefore, be made known to the ends of the earth.

Gospel Luke 1:26-38 Mary, only a young girl at the time, accepts the invitation of the angel Gabriel to become the mother of God's Son.

Message from Fr. Peter: And a very happy and holy Christmas to you all... when it comes! First of all we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent. And let's not forget that Christmas, like Easter, has it's own Octave, eight days of especial celebration, taking us right through to the beginning of 2024. And on top of the Christmas Octave, almost everyday of the Octave has its own celebration too. Tuesday 26th is the Feast of St. Stephen, upon which Good Wenceslas famously looked out. St. Stephen is honoured as the First Christian Martyr, whose death and immediate entrance into heaven remind us of the consequences of that very first Christmas. On Wednesday 27th we remember St. John, the youngest Apostle, the only one to stay faithful with Christ throughout the crucifixion, who tradition tells us stayed with our Blessed Mother Mary after the resurrection, and gave us the fourth Gospel, the prologue of which tells us so much about Jesus as the Light coming into the world. Thursday is the Feast of the Holy Innocents, murdered by Herod in his search for the King of the Jews, and venerated now as martyrs. Friday 29th is the English Feast of St. Thomas Becket, famously murdered in Canterbury Cathedral by the henchmen of King Henry II, and the weekend gives us the Feast of the Holy Family, and we listen to the story of Jesus being presented in the Temple, with the Good Man Simeon proclaiming Jesus As the 'Light to the Gentiles', but also prophesying Jesus' death on the cross, the sorrow of which would pierce the soul of his Mother, before we celebrate the Feast of the Mother of God on January 1st! What a wonderful week! Let's make sure that Christmas is not just one day, but one week leading us to a whole year, that as the Parishes of St Joseph and St Peter, we can celebrate together the love of Christ, come to this earth on the first Christmas day, and who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen! And... when it comes... a very Happy, Holy and Peaceful Christmas to you all. I look forward to celebrating our Christmas Services with you, and to sharing together a wonderful New Year together. Fr. P.
