Sat Vigil: P. Huskinson & D. Warwick Sun 9.15am: M Skene & M Lehman **This Week's Readings:** Throughout the world the Church is celebrating with great joy the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. We share that joy and praise God in this Eucharist.

First Reading Acts 10:34, 37-43 Peter proclaims the early Church's belief in the risen Lord and tells the amazing story of Jesus among them after the resurrection.

Second Reading *Colossians 3:1-4* St Paul reminds the Colossians that real life lies beyond what can be seen and experienced in the here and now. With Christ there is much more.

Gospel John 20:1-9 John gives a detailed account of how the disciples reacted to the resurrection.

**Message from Fr. Peter:** By the time you read this it will be Easter, having celebrated the beautiful Easter Vigil, with its dramatic imagery of fire and candles, or the shouts of Alleluia that begin our Easter Sunday morning Masses, concluding a Triduum of Services which has involved washing children's feet, silent adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and worshipful commemoration of the death of the Lord Jesus. But Easter isn't just about one day. First of all we have a whole Octave of Easter to celebrate, and in the Church that means every day of this coming week is Easter Sunday. But further to that we have a whole Fifty days of the Easter Season to celebrate to lead us to Pentecost, the fiftieth day, the birthday of the Church. So make a pledge to celebrate and have a wonderful, joyful Eastertide! **Alleluia! Alleluia!**
