#### This Sunday's Readings: 3rd Sunday of Easter

The risen Christ calls us through his word and sacraments to come to him. He calls us whether we are at work or rest, in childhood, adulthood or old age.

**First Reading** *Acts* 5:27-32, 40-41 The apostles continue their new work of proclaiming the resurrection of Christ, and are happy to suffer for the sake of his name.

**Second Reading** *Apocalypse 5:11-14* John has a vision of the saints and angels praising the Lamb of God, a symbol of the slain but victorious Christ.

**Gospel John 21:1-19** The risen Jesus comes to the apostles at the end of an unsuccessful night. He brings them warmth, food and new strength for the work entrusted to them.

Message from Fr. Peter: The weeks of this joyful Eastertide follow the days after the Resurrection of Jesus on easter Sunday, though Ascension Thursday (on May 29<sup>th</sup>), right through to the great celebration of Pentecost and our recalling of the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles fifty days after Easter. The prayer 'Come, Holy Spirit' is a most appropriate prayer to pray in this season. It's actually a very ancient prayer, really a collection of mini lines and prayers which were put together by the praying faithful over the centuries. Some of its lines, for example. 'Send forth you Spirit, and they shall be created' go right back to the Book of Psalms in the Old Testament', while other parts of the prayer can be traced right back to the early theologian Hippolytus from the second century, through a European Monk named Rabanus Maurus who wrote a song called 'Come, Creator Spirit,' and onwards through to the twelfth century when the prayer become a common text for the Church throughout the world. As I say, it's a beautiful prayer to pray anytime, certainly during Eastertide, but perhaps especially in this time of 'sede vacante' as we wait for the election of a new Pope. Let us pray the prayer at our masses this week, seeking the inspiration of the Holy Spirit for the College of Cardinals, that a worthy successor will be chosen to follow on the work of Pope Francis and his predecessors, going right back to St. Peter – present in the Upper Room on that very first Pentecost Sunday.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created, and you shall renew the face of the earth.

Let us pray. O God, who have taught the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant that in the same Spirit we may be truly wise and ever rejoice in his consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
