This Sunday's Readings: 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Christ is the bringer of peace. He asks us to be his fellow workers in bringing his peace to the world.

First Reading *Isaiah 66:10-14* Through the prophet Isaiah, the Lord promises to bless his people with peace, comfort and plenty.

Second Reading *Galatians 6:14-18* Paul reminds his flock that what binds them together is the cross of Christ, not race or nationality.

Gospel Luke 10:1-11, 17-20 Jesus chooses more fellow workers to help spread the Gospel, and announces the beginning of the end for Satan.

Message from Father Peter: This Friday 11th we celebrate the Feast of St. Benedict, one of the Patron Saints of Europe, and known as the 'Father of Western Monasticism'. Born around 480AD to a wealthy family, Benedict was drawn to the ascetic life of a hermit, high in the mountains, away from the debauchery of Rome. Other people seeking a similar life were drawn to him, and this led to the building of the famous monastery at Monte Cassino, where the monks, as today, lived a life of prayer, work, and study, as well as hospitality to others, all under the 'Rule of St. Benedict' which he wrote towards the end of his life. Whether drawn to the monastic life or not (and I'm definitely not), the 'Rule' is still a great read, and hugely appropriate to this day and age, perhaps more than ever, in its call to work for the common good, to have respect for all peoples, and a sense of hospitality and welcome to all, all combined with 'moderation in all things', as well as the two fold Christianity identities of work and prayer for the Lord – along with an emphasis on scriptural and ecclesiastical study, and finally reminding us that the rule is only 'a beginning to perfection'. I actually read the rule just last night (it's not a huge tome), in a new modern, translation (which I downloaded on to my Kindle), and was wryly struck at how it suggests a way of life and ideas for living which so many modern 'self-help' books regularly promote as something new to the twenty-first century - it's fifteen hundred years old! This is Benedict's prayer: O gracious and holy God, Give us wisdom to know vou, Intelligence to understand vou, Diligence to seek vou, Patience to wait for you, Eyes to behold you, A heart to meditate upon you, A life to proclaim you. To the power of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, May we see the face of Christ in others. May we listen to others with the ear of our heart. Amen. Incidentally, I wanted to be a Gregorian monk, but I never got the chants. I'll get my coat, and my habit...
