This Sunday's Readings: "Who is my neighbour?" This is the question asked of Jesus in today's Gospel. His response has enormous implications for how we are called to relate to the world around us, particularly to the poor and vulnerable.

First Reading *Deuteronomy 30:10-14* Although God is surrounded by mystery and absolute knowledge is beyond finite, human grasping, nevertheless God chooses to be known and the divine is revealed among us in a manner we can comprehend and to which we can readily respond.

Second Reading Colossians 1:15-20 All things were created through Christ and for him.

Gospel Luke 10:25-37 Jesus recounts the parable of the Good Samaritan in order to instruct his followers regarding who is to be considered as their neighbour. He says that we should love our neighbours as well as we love ourselves.

Message from Father Peter: Monday was a busy day, but a lovely day. It started with my usual walk to SP's for 9am Mass, followed by Confession sand Exposition. After a quick decaff skinny latte in Wetherspoons (cheapest coffee in town), bumping into parishioners in there having their post-mass breakfast, it was on to St. Peter's School for a lovely Mass with Year 6 and Reception together, with Parents and Grandparents, on the theme of allowing our Good Works to be seen, as St. Philip did when he met the Ethiopian on the road, baptizing him in a roadside pool of water. After Mass, on the way back to the Presbytery, I managed a visit to one of sick Parishioners (whilst I obviously don't always have the Blessed Sacrament with me, I do generally carry my Holy Oil of the Infirm (in that handy little pocket in the right of my jeans)), and how grateful we should all be to SJ's Care and SP's SVP for their regular visiting of our sick. After a quick lunch (a healthy bowl of All Bran), I walked up to Clifton Hospital. Each week the chaplain of the Victoria sends messages of any Patients who have been transferred, so I was able to make contact with four Patients (one of whom was an old dear Parishioner I knew from Bispham). Then it was a quick walk to Stella Matutina for the Vigil Reception Mass for dear Sister Margaret, in preparation for her requiem the following day. At the Mass I also had the opportunity to anoint all the residents who were in the chapel for their regular four o'clock celebration of Mass on TV with Holy Communion from the Tabernacle. Then back to SJs for Monthly Vespers, which, being the month of July, and following the Church's monthly themes, was in Honour of the Precious Blood of Christ. The day ended with our weekly session with the SJSP Ukulele Orchestra – an hour every week which could not be more happy and fun. So, having walked 20,842 steps, covering 16.2 kilometres, it only remained to say Compline, the last prayer of the Church's day, before bed. What a wonderful day, and how blessed am I to have been called by the Lord to do such work, for so many amazing people, and participate in His mission here at SJSP's!
