This Sunday's Readings: 14 September Exaltation or Triumph of the Cross There have been many examples of the power of the Cross down through the ages. Many battles were won under its protection. It is most important for our spiritual battles with the powers of evil.

First Reading: Nb 21:4-9 The scene from the Book of Numbers prefigures the death of Jesus on the cross. Just as the Israelites were freed from the poison of the serpents by looking at the standard with the bronze serpent stuck on it, so would we be saved from the poison of evil by trusting in Jesus on the cross.

Second Reading: Ph 2:6-11 This is one of the greatest and most moving passages in all St Paul's writings. Jesus was by very nature, God; by right he was equal to God. Yet he emptied himself, he poured himself out completely in sacrifice for us. He took the form of a slave - he became one of us. He humbled himself, he became obedient to death even to death on a cross. As a result he has been given a name above all names. Jesus is Lord and everyone should bend their knees and proclaim the glory of God.

Gospel: Jn 3:13-17 In the gospel, Jesus speaks of this scene to Nicodemus. It prefigures what is going to happen to him.

Message from Father Peter: If you peruse the Arts pages of the newspapers (or the Arts pages of the Newspapers on the Internet, as I do), you'll know there has been a new production of 'Evita' at the Palladium in London (which a parishioner at SP's attended last week - huge thanks for the mug to add to my collection!). The 'Opera' (as it calls itself) begins with a setting of the Salve Regina (sung at the Requiem of Eva Peron), otherwise known in English as the 'Hail, Holy Queen', one of the four Marian Hymns which we sing at the end of Compline, the Night Prayer of the Church - we also traditionally recite it towards the end of the Rosary. The Prayer was composed during the Middle Ages and spread throughout Europe via various Monasteries and religious communities, and by the nineteenth century was a common prayer of the Church. The Prayer addresses Mary as a model of humanity, to whom we can identify, as 'children of Eve', and acknowledges that while there are difficulties and sorrows in this world, bringing forth tears and sighs - our own and those of others for whom we pray - we ask Mary to lead us in our fallen humanity to the fruit of her womb. Jesus our Saviour. The Month of September is traditionally dedicated to Mary, Mother of Sorrows, and with so many sorrows in this world, not least the anti-Catholic attack on children at Mass just two weeks ago, the prayer is more appropriate - and perhaps more necessary - than ever. Hail Holy Queen, Mother of mercy, Our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us. And after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement O loving O sweet Virgin Mary.
