This Sunday's Readings: Today's Gospel invites us to listen to the message of the Law and the Prophets. As we begin this celebration, let us open our hearts to the word of God, so that it might be the light that guides our lives.

First Reading Amos 6:1, 4-7 A stark warning: the self-satisfied rich will be the first to be punished.

Second Reading 1 Timothy 6:11-16 Paul encourages Timothy to persevere in doing what is right.

Gospel Luke 16:19-31 It is not enough to do no harm. To be human means responding to the needs of others.

Message from Father Peter: And once again this Friday is the First Friday of the Month (are there two First Fridays every month, or am I just getting old?), which means of course we have our Healing Mass held at SJ's with Anointing of the Sick, followed by refreshments in the Hall. Of course, we could have this Mass any day of the month at all, but First Friday's have a special place in the devotional life of the Church. In the seventeenth century Our Lord appeared to Margaret Mary Aloque between 1673 and 1675, at the Convent of the Visitation in Paray-le-Monial, in the middle of France (not far from the town of Ars, known to us as being the home Parish of the great Patron of Priests in Parishes, St. John Vianney) during which Our Lord revealed to Margaret his Most Sacred Heart, symbolising his love for mankind, which was so often sadly rejected. Our Lord encouraged Margaret to spread devotion to his Most Sacred Heart, one way of which was to make a devotion of nine First Fridays in Reparation for sins against the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In the words of St. Margaret: 'On Friday during Holy Communion, "He said these words to His unworthy slave, if I mistake not: 'I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that Its all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on nine first Fridays of consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they will not die under My displeasure or without receiving their sacraments, My divine Heart making Itself their assured refuge at the last moment." Traditionally as well as receiving Holy Communion you go to Confession, although it is also said that this is only necessary if you conscientiously believe it to be so. As we have a First Friday Mass, when not make this beautiful devotion a part of your regular prayer life? I'm usually around beforehand if you would like confession, also. This is St. Margaret's Prayer to the Sacred Heart: 'Lord Jesus, let my heart never rest until it finds You, who are its centre, its love, and its happiness. By the wound in Your heart pardon the sins that I have committed whether out of malice or out of evil desires. Place my weak heart in your own divine heart, continually under your protection and guidance, so that I may persevere in doing good and in fleeing evil until my last breath. Amen.'
